Informant states that on Sept. 1st at Mouquet, Lee and the rest of the 13th Field Ambulance (15) who are missing were together, and were taken by a Belgian Guide through the trenches, they got right into the German trenches. Being unarmed it is supposed they were taken prisoners. We took Mouquet two days after. Informant was in the search for them but nothing was seen living or dead.
