of the officers and I know that Lt. B. Macdowall, D.Coy. (was
in C.Coy. at that time) made a statement about him and would
be able to give information. He said he would write to his
people but I don't know whether he did so. Elms was born in
Regland, he came from W. Australia, where he was working in
a brick-kiln. He was small, fair, about 35/38 years, married,
had a wife in Australia.
