M. Aug 6-9/16:

Llewellyn was shot through the lungs at Lone Pine and died in the trenches there soon after being hit, on the night of 6th August, 1916. Sergeant Rider, of 4th Battalion, 4th Reinforcements, saw this and told informant about it on the Hospital Ship on 8th or 9th August, they having been wounded at the same fight. Sergeant Rider has gone back to Australia, discharged. Llewellyn was the son of a Minister of religion in New South Wales. He was tall, of refined appearance and well educated. He acted as pay corporal to his company.
