# "Killed in Action 29-7-18"

I was with him on July 29th. I was waiting for him at a Relay Post. He was bringing elong a woundedman. Assisted by a "Yank". Knight was hit in the femeral artery by a piece of shell. The "Yank" applied tourniquet and went back to tge Relay Post for assistance. Knight was carried back to the Relay where he died from less of blood about 9 c'clock p.m. He was buried by his own unit the next day in a mixed cemetery just cutside the village of Yaux. The ground was held.

# E. July 29th, 1918.

Enight was working with an American on a wheeled stretcher. There were a good many Americans with us just there and he changed ends. He had hardly done so when w shell came over and killed him while the Americans was not touched. When I say he was killed, he lived about 10 minutes. He died, it was said from the shock, but I think he died from loss of blood for the artery at the top of the left thigh was cut by a piece of shell. Enight was about 5. 9. or 5. 10, was well built and rather dark. He came from the Eastern States so far as I know and was about 20 to 23 years of age. He was buried at Dawes(?) and a cross factors was put up. There is a big cemetery in the place I mean. GFO.

He was buried in a cemetery behind, just near Dehors. We all marched to the funeral. I saw him buried. A padre was present. There was no c css put up then, but I heard one was put up next day. He was very well liked.
