" On Oct. 27th., 'I6, we were holding the front line at Fleurs, and during the afternoon, Leslie was killed by a "Whizz-bang". He was taken back at once, but died an hour after he had been hit, and He was buried just over the papapet of Cobden Trench, by the Divisional burial party. No service was held, but a cross was erected over the grave, bearing his name, number, and battalion. It should be easily traceable ". If you writ to Lt Seymour, 5th Div, Eurial Party, he will be able to give you full details of a number of burials from our battalion, as he was in charge If you write Description. Hgt 5ft6. #### Killed in Action 27/10/16.

**Leslie came to us from the 3rd Battn. a few weeks before he was killed** His name was Roy and he was in B.Co. V Platoon with me. He was tall dark elight build. He wond I were in a trench togethor near Flers at the end of Cotober 1916 beforme the big minut attack the first time the 54th went into the Somme. I relieved him from his place on the fire step and he was asleep at the bettom of the trench a few yards away from re when a while bung shell came over. Whilst we were dressing his bounds he died. He way unconscious all the time and did not suffer. I think it was more the shock then the injuries that caused his death. I helped to bury him the same night after the Doctor has seen his body. We took his disc and papers and handed ther in to the officer in charge Lt. Smith He was buried a few yards away from where he was killed. The saps leading to this trench was known as Yurk Lane and Goose Alley. Spt.Kelly
