He was admitted to this hospital 18.2.17, suffering from Cerebro-Spinal Fever. He died at 5.2.m. on 25.2.17, and was buried at the Souvenir Cemetery, Longuenesse, near St Omer, on 26.2.17. The officiating clergyman, the Rev, C. L. Graham, has since left this hospital.
