

## "Died of Wounds"

I regret that owing to the lapse of time it is impossible to give any but the barest details of the illness of the above-named soldier. He was admitted to this hospital 18.2.17, suffering from Cerebro-Spinal Fever. He died at 5.2.m. on 25.2.17, and was buried at the Souvenir Cemetery, Longuenesse, near St Omer, on 26.2.17. The officiating clergyman, the Rev. C. L. Graham, has since left this hospital.
