

Station at Marrett Wood near Treux at about 1.30 a.m. on July 6/18. I was close by but did not see it. Pte. Bugg.M.M.
S/Bearer of Cos. 60th A.I.P. who is now in France, was close to him and took him to the D.S. I was present at his funeral next day at the British Military Cemetery at Mericourt 1. Abbé (Anore). Lt. Knight was 0/C. of IX Pl. C Coy. His name was Meroyn and initials M.D. He was about 5.10 and 27, had been away at Musketry Instructor for 8 months at the 2nd Army School in Flanders and had only rejoined about a week. Has a brother a driver in Australian Motor Transport to whom I gave all particulars and who has visited his grave."

On July 6 we were in front of Morlandourt, when Mr. Knight was killed, being hit by a shell which burst close to him. I did not see him hit, but think he was buried in the small country between Heilly and Morlandourt. There was opportunity for burying the dead. Even to a point 2/300 yards nearer the enemy line. Cpl J. Curran can give details of burial. Mr. Enight was about 5 ft. 7, and of medium baild.

He was with 9th Platcon in C.Company and I saw him killed near Mcriancourt when death was instantaneous, he being hit by a piece of shell that went right through his body. We were behind the lines after being relieved, when a shell landed close beside no, killing him. Casualty happened just at break of day on July 6/18. I know him well and he came from Melbourne, Victoria. He was the most popular officer we had, and everyone was sorry he had been killed. I was at his burial, the same day at Mericourt where he was buried in a small cemetery. The grave was marked by a cross having full details marked thereon.

I was near to Mr. Enight and clearly saw him killed. He was hit in the back and chest by simapnel from a shell which burst close to him. We were coming from the front line at Mclincourt at the time. He was buried in the civil cemetery at Merrincourt. I have seen the grave.

I knew him well for he lived opposite to where my people lived in Mitfore Street, St.Kilda, Melbourne, where he was a tally clerk in a timber yard. He was about 28 and had been in Gallipoli as a Private in the 4th Aust.Light Horse. He was buried at Mericourt.

I was not near when it occurred but I saw the place where he died, afterwards. He had a proper funeral and was buried at Ribemont Cemetery. He was a very popular Officer: a good athlete, about 29-30 years of age.

He had done magnificent work. He was in charge of quite a new line and was just standing having a look round when a shell burst quite close. He was hit on the left side of his head and killed instantly. I saw his body taken away but I remained in the line and do not know where he was buried. B.& C.Coys. were operating together then. He was G.Coy. and had already get the M.C. He was certain to have get semathing else for his work then, had he lived.
