On a German Death List dated 26.3.17 we received the information that 6304 Charles Norris Lake of your battalion (reported missing 1.2.17) had died in hospital and was buried at the Cemetery of Notre Dame - Cambrai.

On a later German List (dated 21.4.17) this same man is clearly shown as having been transferred from Cambrai to Limburg. We have frequently found these German reports of death and burial to be unreliable - but we have to date had no post card from Pte. Lake asking for food parcels etc.

One of our searchers in France now sends in a report from a man in the battalion stating that he has seen a post card written from Germany by either 6304 C. N. Lake or 6388 W. Lake - he is not sure which.
