"Died of Wounds"

Pte. W. F. W. A. Fox was admitted on the 13th and died on the 14th after being most severely wounded by shell in the right arm, which was shattered. Buried in Nine Elms Cemetery which is near Popersange.

"At Passchendaele in Oct 1917, Fox received a small wound in the arm and was able to walk back, it was during the night. He was sent to England, where he died".

"Died of Wounds 14-10-17"

Fox was a runner in the B.H.Q. He was wounded at Passchendaele on October 14th 1917. Two days after the stunt in one of his arms by a piece of shell. He was taken to the D/S and died at the C.C.S. he was buried at Passchendaele, informant thinks. The ground was held.

He was admitted on the 13th & died on the 14th after being most severely wounded by shell in the right arm, which was shattered.

2. No 3783 Pte C. G. Rosenberg 17th Bn A.S.F.

He arrived on the 20.9.17 & died the same day. He had been wounded in the face, leg & thigh & his right hand was shattered.

Both these men's remains were buried in "Nine Elms" Cemetery which is near Popersinghe.
