I don't know if his body was recovered. He was 2nd in command of A.Coy., a university man and very popular with us.

I saw Lt. Gibbs wounded by the creek in No Man's Land about 100 yerds away from the German front line tranches at Fleur Baix on July 19th 1916. He went down in a heap. We were driven back at this point. The grass was high and I did not see him again. I made enquiries but could hear nothing further at all about him. I concluded that he died where he fell.
