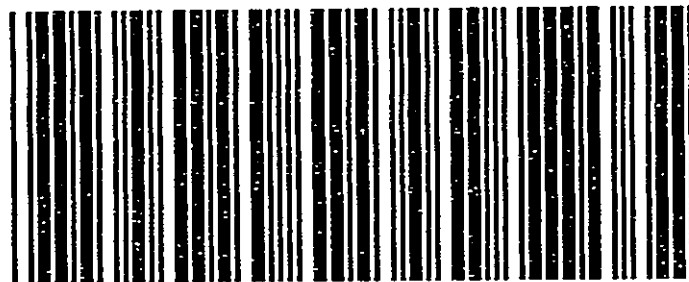

Fellow^s was evacuated from Poiches (near Avesnes) and died of influenza with broncho)pneumonia complications at 53rd C/C/S and was buried at British Military Cemetery, LE Cateau, Sheet 57B.Q.5.a.5.9.

Fellow was a very fine lad and always willing for a job, the transport Officer thought a lot of him. He was not strong-looking but stuck it well right through. He was with Transport Officer, Capt. E.J. McNabb, Guyra, M.S.W. all through and Capt. McNabb would be able to speak of his work.

We have been informed by A.I.F. Hqs that 2689 L/Cpl. J.B. Murray, 1st M.T. Co. one of the survivors of the Leinster returned to Australia per D. 34 (1914 leave) 5th M.D. Will you interview him? We have also written twice on 28/11/18 and 19/12/18 to 1237 Pte J. A. Meigan 17th (late 19th) Battn., another survivor but have so far received no reply. If he returns to Australia will you get into touch with him? We are now attempting to trace 2531 Dvr. P.L. Hopkins the only remaining survivor on the list given to us by Hqs but in event of his return to Australia will you try to interview him?

the following report from the O.C. 53rd Casualty Clearing
Station, B.I.F.

"Dvr. Fellow was admitted to this Casualty Clearing
Station on the 27th November suffering from Influenza
Broncho pneumonia developed and patient died at
14.30 hours on 3rd Dec. 1917. The Burial took place
at the Gateau British Cemetery on the 4th December
1917. Major Robertson writes that "Dvr. Fellow was

influenza with broncho pneumonia complications at
53rd Casualty Clearing Station and was buried at
British Military Cemetery, Le Gateau, Sheet 57/B.Q.5.
