I knew a Fowler in C Coy he was a V Reinf. and his number would be 1900 odd. He was killed on 22nd Aug. 1915 at Australis Gully, just as they fell in. A bullet went clean through Pte Meldrum's shoulder in the front rank and then hit Fowler in the head and killed him. Meldrum and I were wounded the same day and Meldrum told me about it on the hospital ship. There was only one Fowler in C Coy.

There were two Fowles in the Batt. The one with that number was of G.Co. On the 21st. of August, we had advanced on our left to straighten our line and to connect it with the Suvla Bay force. A.J.Fowle was immediately in front of me and a bullet went through his head and killed him. The same bullet wounded me in the left shoulder.
