could do anything to improve it, but could not - It is
in a row with others and marked with the usual cross.
I should say he was about 20, 5ft 9 or so, dark hair,
inclined to be curly.

Fox was a thick-set nuggety chap, about 5'6" and dark. He was perhaps 26 or 27 and came from Hobart, Tasmania. He enlisted at Queenstown and was one of my mates.

He was in the support line when he was killed by one of our own 8 in. shells which fell short. He died next day at the Aid Post and was afterwards buried by the Pioneers at Tincourt. I saw his grave.
