Fisher was conscious and crawled away from where he was hit - was greaning. I have since had a letter from Pte Dysll. 4004. A.Company. III Platoon. now in France stating that Fisher died of Wounds, he was missing for a few days, but was found by someone who handed in his pay book to Battn.H.Q. Letter says nothing of buriel.

Pte.Chaunay, B.Coy. was next to Fisher at Villers Bretonneux at the time he was hit. It was our second advance to the L. of Villers Bretonneux and we were all taking whatever cover we could as the enemy's barrage was very heavy at the time. A shell killed Fisher outright. I was about 75 yards off at the time. Chaunay told me he was killed. Wylie was killed also in the same stunt, but rather later, when we had dug ourselves in. Both were buried close by. We held the line for 4 days when we were relieved. Both were in A.Coy. There was only one man named Fisher in the Battn.






