I think Goldstone was in D Co. He was a Sgt. and an original man, a runner, medium build, dark hair, clean shaven. I do not remember whether it was the Messines or Ypres attack, but I think the former in June when he was killed. I did not see him killed but when I was coming back wounded, I saw his body lying in the open. He had been hit all over and obviously killed outright.
