Was admitted to the Government Hospital on June 6th 1915. He was operated on on June 11th. He was very bad indeed with "abdominal wounds penetrating intestines". He was in a comatose state nearly all the time.

He was nursed by Sisters Wardlow and Sanders, now at the Government Hospital. The Doctors attending him were:

The O.C. Dr. Ekins now at the Hospital.

Dr. Webb-Jones do.

The Matron also took a great interest in the case.

Died 11th June 1915. Buried at Chatby Military Cemetery, Alexandria, No. of Grave 1057.
