

I know deorge well. He was Corporal and I was in his section. His initials were A.T. He was fairly tall, clean shaven, and about 27/28. We exclude him 'Roy'. He was with us at Bailloul and came to Albert on the Somme. We went over the top and he went with us. All of a fuddon he went down, shot between the eyes. I was about 4 yards from him and passed by him and taw the wound. We got pushed back. George was left in No Man's Land and we could not get to him.

He was Corporal in A.Co. IV Plin came from near Sydney, single and was close to me whom he was killed. This was on the counter-strok close to Aldert about 6 p.m. while out in the open, and we did not succeed in our objective, and the dead we were left behind as we had to retire.

This man was a Corporal. I know him well but am not sure of his initials. He was tallish a athletic & full of fun. On April 5th.we were at Dernicourt holding the line. In the afternoon we attacked & got to out objective. We then withdraw some way to a stock yard & near there was George was hit by a bullet in the stomach & killed right out. His body was left by the side of the stock Yard. I wont out to try & get the body but the H. G. Fire was too heavy. As far as I know it was not buried.

"Killed 5-4-18"

George was a Cpl. and was killed by a machine gun bullet near the stock yards. Pioneer trench, between Albert Road and Dernancourt. Hit in head and body, and killed cutright. I saw him killed. He was left on the field though we intended going out that night to get his body, but were relieved before we could do so. He was in "No Man's Land".

He was in A Coy. ly Fltu. single. He was shot through the heart in the attack at Dermacourt, and killed instantly, and were buried just behind the trench there, and his name was on a cross erected for the Battalion.

George was in "C" Company. I was in "D" Company. I first met him about 7 years before the War started. He lived in my District. He had fair hair and was about 5 feet 10 inches or 11 inches in height.

At the end of July, or the beginning of August I saw his grave in the Cemetery at Mellinsourt. I recognised it by the cross on the grave.
