

At 3 p.m. on June 30 at Passchendaele he was in a shell hole when he was hit in the body by a shell and died the same day. He was buried in the shell hole. I was 20 yards away and pressing forward and did not see him after. Cpl. Holmes C Co., gone to England gassed, was nearer to Henderson and told me details. Henderson was about 5 ft.6, 22, fair and jolly.

He was wounded by a M.G. Bullet at Strazeele and died of internal Memorrage. I did not see him but the S/Bearer who carried him out told me. He died at the C.G.S. and was probably buried at Borre. He came from Horsham, Victoria. He was in the same Plateon.

#### "Died of Wounds 30-6-18"

Re 567.Pte.J.S.Henderson. late 6th Battalien. I am serry to say I am unable to give much detail as regards death, etc. of same. He was sent as an advence guerde for curplateen at Passchendaele "Ypres" about Oct. 22nd 1917. and our arrival in the line next night, I learned that most of the party had been wounded and he was included as one of the badly wounded. Later I was teld by our Company Clerk (Cpl Gould) that Pte Henderson had died of wounds, but this was before June 30th 1918. I presume he died, and was buried at some C.C.S. or hespetal in France.

#### "Died of Weunds 30-6-18"

It was in front of Merris and we were in line and were ordered to go forward that night. We went 80 or 100 yards and dug in, while digging in he got badly knocked and was carried out by S/B. One of the Bearers was Pte Jack Lee. A.Coy. 8th Battn. and the other Pte Carmichael. A.Coy. He was the same platoon as myself (No 3)

#### "Died of wounds -30-6-18."

Henderson was hit by Machine Gun fire a bullet went in his right shoulder and passed through his body lodging berween his right on the other side. I dressed him, and in Company with another stretcher bearer carried him back to our support line where we were relieved by another scad of bearers who carried him on to the dressing station. An hour or so later I carried another lad to the dressing station and being a friend of Pte. Henderson's I enquiried how he was. I was told he had died. He was buried by the 8th Bath padre in a small Cemetery near Strazele. This ere is an 8th Bath. Cross over his grave.

He was a medium height man fairly dark, about 27 I should

say.

In further reference to your enquiry for 567 Pte. J.S. HENDERSON. 8th Battalion. A.I.F. We beg to inform you that we have received a report from 1st Australian Field Ambulance to the effect that he died of wounds in the left chest, fractured ribs and injury to the liver on 30.6.18. He was buried in the British Cemetery at Boore 13 miles E of Hazebrouck. D.G.R.P.L.S.5 1696, being the identification number of Pte. Henderson's grave.

We are continuing our enquiries and will advise you as soon as we obtain further particulars.

JOHN STUART HENDERSON. 8th Battalion. A.I. F. We beg to inform you we have received the following unofficial report from 512 Pte. G.H. Lee of the same Unit to whom we wrote for information.

"I was the Stretcher bearer on the spot at the time
Pte. Henderson was hit by machine gun fire, a bullet
went in his right shoulder and passed through his
body lodging between his ribs on the other side. I
dressed him, and in company with another stretcher
bearer carried him back to our supports line where
he were relieved by another squad of bearers who
carried him on to the dressing station. An hour or so
later I carried another lad to the dressing station
and being a friend of Pte. Henderson's I enquiried
how he was . I was told he had died. He was buried
by the 8th 8ttn padre in a small Cemetery near Strazeele
There is an 8th 8ttn cross over his grave. He was a medium
height man, fairly dark, about 27 I should say."

He was buried in the shell hole and informant was 20 yards away, and pressing forward did not see him afterwards. Cpi' Holmes. C.Vo., was hearer to Henderson and told details. Pte. Thomas and the latter describes him as 5'6", 22" fair and jolly."

He have written to Pter Thomas and as soon as we receive a reply we shall advise you and trust it will be of some commiscion to you to know that Pte. Henderson was killed instantly. Any further reports we receive we will at once forward to you.

We beg to state that we have received the following unofficial report from 6395 Pte.J.O. Grant, of the same unit who was interviewed in an Australian Camp in France.

He states: that Pte. Henderson was wounded by a machine gun bullet at Strazeele and died of internal hemorrhage. Grant did not see him but the Stretcher bearers who carried him out teld him that he died at the Casualty Clearing Spation and was probably buried at Borre. He came from Horeham, Victoria, and he and Grant were in the same Platoon."

We are continuing our enquiries and any further details we obtain we will at once forward to you and trust that it will be of some consolation to know that his death took place notlong after he was wounded.

Henderson was badly wounded and carried out by stretcher bearers. Ho gives the names of the stretcher bearers as Pte.J. Lee and Pte. Carmichael both of A.Coy, of the 6th Battalion.

We are writing to these men for further reports, and when we receive their replies will at once advise you. Again assuring you of our sympathy and trusting that we shall be successful in Obtaining definite information.
