I knew him well. His number was 1169, and he was in D Co. He came from Murray Bridge. His father is a painter there. I was with L/Cpl. Harvey in the German 2nd line on April 11/17, daylight. We had taken the trench that morning. He was wounded in the arm by ~~sketch~~ ^{sketch} ~~sketch~~. A stretcher bearer had bound up the wound, and Harvey started away towards the Dressing Station in our own lines. The way there was under shell fire. I did not see or hear any more of him.
