(H. July 19th 1916)

Informant states that on July 15th 1916 at Fleurbaix, the Germans raided a trench and blew the dug-outs in with bombs. They took no prisoners and retired again. Pte. Glew was buried. All the "Geelong" Company were blown up or buried. Informant helped bury the remains of 2 of them. It was impossible to say who they were, but the whole Company was killed. It was a Saturday night the 15th July.

At Fleurbaix on the 19th July during the big attack Glew was killed. I did not see him killed but I saw his body and helped to bury him in the Special Australian Cemetery at the back of Fleurbaix. The grave was marked by a cross. He came from Chilwell, Geelong, Victoria and used to drive a motor boat for his father.
