He was a L/Cpl. in D Co., and was killed in front of Bapaume Cemetery on the 17th March, and is buried with Sergt. Wilcox and others in the cemetery there. I knew this man's number, and that he went away in July with a bad hand, and rejoined just before Xmas. He was very short, fair, married, about 30, and belonged to Victoria. He belonged to the 9th Reinforcements.
