In answer to your letter of 21st inst. regrets to say that according to the records Captain F.C. Gregory, M.C. 3rd County of London Yeomany (attached to Camel Corps) died of wounds (whilst serving in Egypt) on 29.11.17. Place of burial : Convent Garden Cemetery, Ramleh, Palestine.

The Officer's next of kin is his widow Mrs. F.C. Gregory, whose address is C/O Bank of Adelaide, 11, Leadenall Street, London, E.C.

He was in the 7th Company, 2nd Battalion, and was about 40 years old.

Witness was administering First Aid about 200 yards from the spot where Captain Gregory was hit, while we were holding a position at Hill 265 near Jaffa. Witness helped the Medical Officer (Captain Shipway, now with the 5th Australian Field Ambulance) to bind him up. He seemed done, but was very game, and he (Gregory) asked the Medical Officer what chance he had. The Medical Officer told Witness there was absolutely no hope. Witness understands he lived a short time and thinks he passed away at Ramleh. *Ramleh*
