buried above the line but the line  
has been advanced since then. His  
grave is on a ridge close to a sunken  
road. He used to call me Mc Connell.  
He was short thickset and his hair  
was inclined to be red. We were in the  
same section for 10 months and I  
would write to his people if I knew  
their address. I will be only too pleased

3551 Sgt Hart of 7<sup>th</sup> BN AIF

Sgt Hart was killed instantaneously by a small shell which passed through his chest. He was buried in the field at the point where French trench crossed the Gaudencourt Rd between Flers & Gaudencourt in the Somme on 16/12/16.

His grave was marked by a rough cross by his comrades

No maps of that area are available otherwise the officer who buried him (Sgt S C Anderson of this unit) could give the exact map location

Hart was on garrison duty on the Gueudecourt front on December 16th 1916, and on the night of that date, under the cover of darkness, he was digging a communication trench, when he was killed by a Bosch explosive shell. Sgt. Pennefather of D Co. could give further details and probably an account of his burial. Speaking for myself I think he was carried to the rear for burial.
