"Died of wounds April 22nd 1917"

Was in D. Coy., 16th Pltn called Victor. I saw him hit- we were getting rations at the time for breakfast- he was hit by a shell it was a very bad wound. It happened just behind Sunken Road near Lagnicourt. He lived about 3 hrs and died just as they got him to the dressing station. He was buried in the cemetery at Bapaume I saw his grave- it had a cross with his name, number, etc.

He was wounded by a heavy shell in the morning as we were in support in the sunken road, Lagnicourt. He was carried away on a stretcher to the D/S in a semi-conscious state and seemed to be dying at that time. Breakfast was being served in front of the dugout where I was and he was standing outside when the shell fell. Description: about 20, dark, clean shaven, and had been a school teacher in Victoria I think.

His name was Victor. He came with me in the 21st Cavalio Reinforcements to the 5th battalion. He came from Winton, near Benalla, Victoria. He was tall, about 6 ft. dark, aged about 20. I saw his grave about 1/2 a mile away from Hopsune, near the 2nd Australian General Hospital in a Military Cemetery, near a railway. The grave was only a few yards from the grave of Capt. Griffiths of the 5th battn. It had a white cross with his name &c. on it.

He was in my Platoon. He called him 'Wio'. He had been a school teacher at Chiltern, Victoria. He had dark hair. was nearly 6ft in height, and about 21 or 22 years of age. I saw his grave at Bapaume Cemetery - the big one, near No. 8 A.I.F. Casualty Clearing Station. It has a wooden cross with his name & battalion on it.

"DIED OF WOUNDS" 22.4.17"

I saw him hit by shell in the Sunken Road, used as a support at Lagnicourt, he was wounded all over. He died at the clearing station 2 days later. I did not see him buried, but saw his grave with a cross on it at Greavillers just outside Bapaume. He was a Public School Teacher, I believe at Rutherglen or close to it, a single man. He had only joined up about 5 weeks.
