There was only one Johnson in our company; I do not know his initials; he was of medium height, and dark complexion. I could not say what his age might be. He was wounded when we were at the Tasmanian Post, in the night. I did not see him wounded but found him lying dead, with blood on his face; no one was near him; under him were two rifle slings, which had been used for carrying him.
