I went out of the line shortly after so don't know what became of the body. I welieve we had to retire later on, not having advanced further or held the position so it is likely he was buried by the enemy. Description - short, fair, rather red headed, age about 22 years. Called him "Dick"

who was Killed in Action on 12-10-17, we beg to inform you of the unofficial evidence of his death given by 6689 L/Cpl. F.V. Chignell of the same unit when at the Norfolk War Hospital, Horwich. He stated that he saw Ptc.O Connell killed by a an iper during the attack at Passchendaele on 12-10-17, and he believes that he was wounded in the stomach. He describes him as being short and very fair and rather stout in build.

We are continuing our enquiries and as soon as we receive further information we shall let you know and trust that it will be some consolation to know that his death was instantaneous.
