He belonged to the 4 Bty as I did and was badly wounded by a piece of H/E shell which cought him in the groin while out on fatigue at Delvillo Wood on Becember 21st. I was with the battery at the time and the cosucity only happened a few yards from me. He was carried away on a stretchor. It was in the dark and I did not see it but heard the arrangements made. Ptc. Denholm, A.V.C. Details, 4th battery, carried him arry. He died of wounds soon afterwards as I heard officially from the battery. Denholm could supply all details. We know him as Roy Budson, He came from Victoria. He was a Bookie College man.
