D/W December 22-23, 1916.

He belonged to the 4 Bty as I did and was badly wounded by a piece of H/E shell which caught him in the groin while out on fatigue at Delville Wood on December 21st. I was with the battery at the time and the casualty only happened a few yards from me. He was carried away on a stretcher. It was in the dark and I did not see it but heard the arrangements made. Pte. Denholm, A.V.C. Details, 4th battery, carried him away. He died of wounds soon afterwards as I heard officially from the battery. Denholm could supply all details. We knew him as Roy Hudson. He came from Victoria. He was a Deakin College man.
