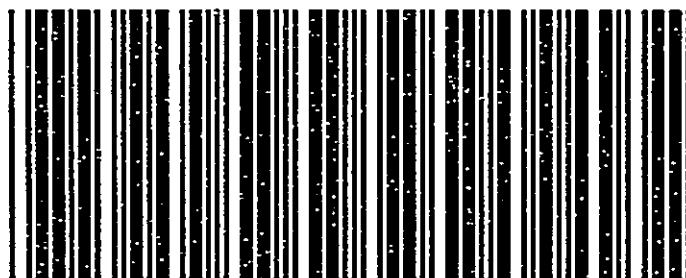

1918. at 6-45 p.m.

He was admitted to this Hospital suffering from Cerebro Spinal
Fever. He was mentally confused when admitted and became worse
we were unable to obtain any address, as he had no papers in his
possessions.

"Missing Sept. 26th-27th 1917."

He was in B. Coy and was a Battn H.Q. Observer. I was told by Pte. H.A. Larkins D. Coy. XV Pltn. that he saw Knox lying in Polywood on Sept. 26th. Larkins was carrying ammunition to the front line and he could not stop as he was in too great a hurry to get to the front line. I was in the attack on that day and we reached the far side of the wood and dug in there and we held it and were relieved on the night of the 27th by the 30th Battn. Knox had only recently lost both his father and mother.
