I was with him at the time at Strazeele Ridge near Merria maxmarking Just before we were to go over the top the Germans threw a hand grenade into the tranch and wounded the Captain, severely in the leg. He was carried out and attended to at Borre, but died shortly afterwards from less of block owing to the fact that as we had no 6/Bs in the tranch we could not attend to him properly, and were a long time getting him out I saw it all. He was buried at Borre.

He was conscious when taken back to Battn. Hqts., and there conversed with Lt.Col.Moore, D.S.O.. and was then taken to dressing station at Borre.
