Reference your enquiry of the 28th inst. I beg to inform you that No / 2460 Sgt. McLachlan, D, 58th Btn. A.I.F. was admitted to this Hospital from France on 17.2.17, suffering from Multiple wounds, amputation thigh Rt, and Septic infection. He died in E. Ward, No. 3 A.G.H. at 1. a.m. on the 3rd. inst.

Buried in Brighton Cemetery at 3.p.m. March 5th. taken by the A.I.F. Pres: Chaplain, Col. Rev.W. Floyd Shannon. Grave site - Section Z.I.X. No. of grave 47.

Personal effects sent to Oi/c Records, A.I.F. on Pay Book to Staff Paymaster, A.I.F. 6.3.17.

I might add that the graves of all soldiers buried in Section Z.I.X. are kept in perfect order by the Cadets of the Brighton Brigade, who have undertaken this work to show honour to the fallen.
