

Re 3134 D/Cpl.G.H.Hindle, who was severely wounded by the explosion of a 5.9. shell and died later. Where his death took place I do not know. I wish to say that these statements are quite correct, because I myself was badly wounded with that same shell which came through the room in which we were sitting.

I knew them both well. Over was about 22, medium figure, amburn hair, and was good at Football. Hindle was about 24, medium height and figure. About the 5th April we were at Courbey supporting. About 6 men, including Gyer and Hindle, were not in the line and were left behind at Go.H.Q. There was a bembarament on and about noon a shell his H.Q. and buried all the men there. They were afterwards dug out and I saw them being taken to the D/Station. heard afterwards that Gyer and Hindle had died in Hospital.

"I knew Cpl. Gilbert Hindle No.3134 intimately. I also knew H. Gyer Fo. 1799 together with a men named Tom Enis (not in O.L.). We were all in the same gun team. we were sent up to the front line at Corbie near Amiens in the beginning of April last. We were billetted in the village. A shell burst in the billet when Cpl. Hindle Gyer, and Enis were all three badly wounded. They were taken to a dressing station somewhere behind Corbie, but I cannot name the exact spot because I remained in the line. heard after from some of the boysthat all three men died from their wounds, either in the dressing or casualty clearing station. Gyer died on the 5th April, and Hindle 2 days later. I am not sure which say Enis died. They would be buried near Corbie. My C.S.Maj. J.Gibb was one of my informants, he should know where they lie buried. Delieve he is still with his Unit. Connot give you any other names."

HINDDE. T.Cpl, G.H.

"Died of Wounds 7-4-18"

I was with Hindle and two others in billets at Corbie on 4th April. In afternoon & p.m. shell fell right into building. Hindle was hit badly about head and shoulder.-conscious. and complaining about his wounds - taken by Ambulance to C.C.S. along with myself. He died two days after at Amiens C.C.S. I was in C.C.S. when he died - know nothing of buriel. Knew him as Gil. The two other men were taken away before us on stretchers. Ptc.H. Gyer 1794, 15th M.G.C. died of wounds next day and was buried in cometery near Amiens. Ptc.T. Hennis. No -- 15th M.G.C. was killed outright. Don't know where buried.
