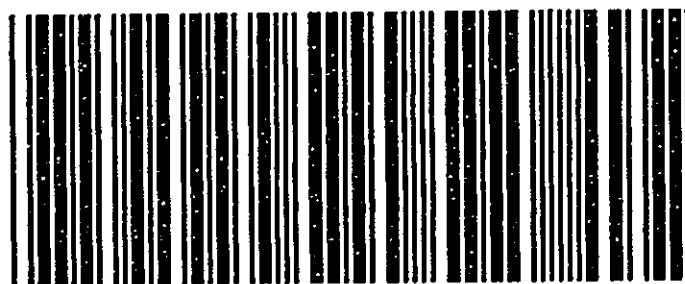

Witness was there but did not see him wounded, but he heard at the time that he had been - and that it happened in the trenches.

On 6th August Nash took part in a charge at Lone Pine. While leading B. Co. he was struck by shrapnel, and was killed instantly. Informant saw his body the same evening, when Nash was buried behind the firing line at Lone Pine.
