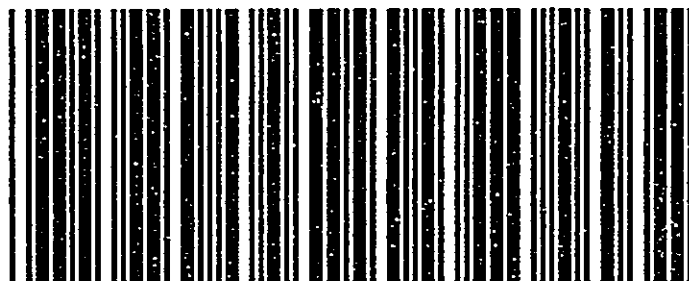

No 21 E.V. Kimmance - 13th Bde
A.F.A. - Ind Wounded 4-1-17.

Wounded at Sun Valley ^{same} on 1st January 1917
while carrying ammunition to Potters on
back mules. Died of wound at Hospital in
London and buried in England - (London??)
Height 5'7" or 5'8" Medium Build.
Age about 21. Complexion fair. Hair inclined
to be red. Known in Battery amongst the boys
as "Pinkie" Kimmance - right name no
doubt because of complexion.
