He belonged to the Intelligence Section, and was killed on the day we came out of Pozieres, (July 25.) He and Fte. L.U.C.Knox, Intelligence Section, were killed by the same shell. Pte.C.R.Tattan, Int.Sec:, said the men of the Section searched for his body. The pocket of Knox's jacket with a book in it was found, and a couple of smashed rifles; but there was no trace of Honsysett's body.
