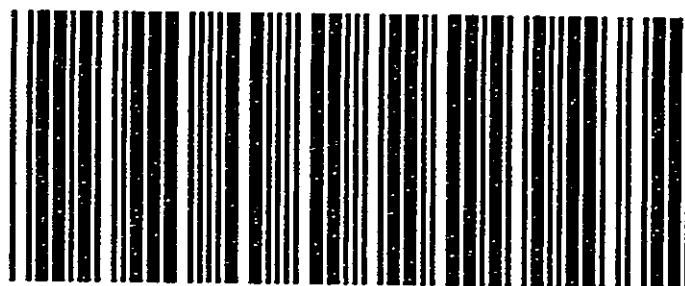

M. July 22-25.1916.

He belonged to the Intelligence Section, and was killed on the day we came out of Pozieres, (July 25.) He and Pte. L.U.C.Knox, Intelligence Section, were killed by the same shell. Pte.G.R.Tattan, Int.Sec., said the men of the Section searched for his body. The pocket of Knox's jacket with a book in it was found, and a couple of smashed rifles; but there was no trace of Honeysett's body.

He belonged to the Intelligence Section of the 1st Battalion. I heard that he was killed at Pozieres the first time we were in. (July 22-25.) L/Cpl.McTaggart, 1 Pl.A.Co. (now Pte.) told me he had seen him killed. I do not know any details. McTaggart is back with the Batt. again. I saw him in Base Details.

been reported missing from head
quarters to me I received a message
on the 1st Sep to the effect that he was missing
from about 22 of July. and a fortnight later
I received a letter a private letter saying
he had been killed in action but as he
as been there as been no report sent
through to the Military Barracks
only that he was missing and we
seem to think he might be a

Prisoner of War. he went through
Gallipoli and was sent to France
in March where he has been reported
Missing from Victoria Barracks
if he has been killed it must be
some mistake of the Military
Department His Surname and
Address is put as Honeysett No 347.
