I knew him well. He came over with me in the 21st reinforcement to the 25th Battn sailing in November 1917, from Sydney. He had been over with the 49th Battn before. On the 10th June we were at Morlancourt and attacked at about 10 p.m. We had got to about Fritz front line when he was hit by a piece of shell and crawled into one of Fritz dugouts. We found him there dead, and we buried him close by. It is in Kiwi Trench, and it is between a wood and Morlancourt and about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the latter place.

I know Private William Jamieson, C. 9. he was a drover in Queensland and came from ~~Queensland~~ in the same Reinforcement as I the 21st. to the 25th. in the s.s. 'Combarra' sailing from Sydney on November 15th. 1917. We landed in Egypt. I was alongside of him at Merlancourt Sector on a raid in 'No Man's Land' on the night of June 10th. 1918. about 10. p.m. dark. We were out about fifty yards when he was wounded by a bullet. I was just going to bandage him when he was shot through the head by a bullet and died instantly. I saw the body after it had been brought back to our lines the same night. I do not know where he was buried. We held the ground.

"Killed 10-6-18."

I think he was of C.Coy. At Morlancourt on the 10th June about 10 o'clock in the evening during our attack he was killed outright by a shell, hit in the back by one of our own shells. I saw his body when I came back for ammunition. We were to the right of the village at the time. I know nothing of burial. I knew him as "Jamie" and he came from Queensland.

"I knew Casualty. He was a well built man, about 6 ft. dark complexion, about 33 years of age, known as "Williams". He embarked from Australia with the 21st Bfets. to the 25th Btn. on the "Canberra". Casualty was in the advance at Morlancourt when an H.E. shell exploded near by killing him instantly. I saw him go down but was wounded shortly after myself and I saw his body as I was being carried out. He was in the same Co. as myself. I do not know where he was buried."
