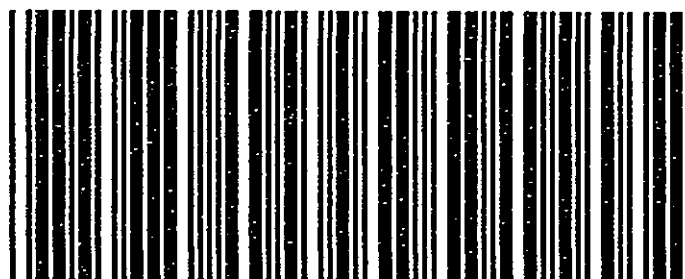

Informant states that on May 2nd at Dead Man's Ridge (Gallipoli) "six of us went up the Ridge at night before the charge, to cut barbed wire and scout the country". Informant feels quite certain that Pte Hooper was one of the six. The others were Sergt. Wise, Pte Lang, Pte Clark, and Pte Mann. Four were killed, and Sergt. Wise (transferred to 45th Battn, D. Coy) and Informant were the only two left. "We stopped there, and the Battn charged up where we were". Informant states that Sergt Wise could probably not tell more than he can, but thinks it would be a good thing if you were to write to Sergt Hooker, 12th Training Battn, Australian Training Camp, Salisbury. He was in the same Section at Gallipoli as Pte Hooper, and could probably give you news and tell you quite definitely whether Pte Hooper was one of the six.
