I knew him well, he was a known footballer in Queensland; he had just got his Seemission, previously; he was C/S/Major. On the leth. Ostober we were holding the line about Annac House. Lieut. Jones, and Captain Bond, 25th. Battalion, Y C. Company, were in a dug-out together, when a shell dropped on the dug-out, and blew off lieut. Jones leg; he died shortly afterwards; and killed Captain Bond. I was told this by C/S/M/. V. D. O'Gonnor, 25th. Battalion, C. Company, who was with the Battalion when I left about a week ago.
