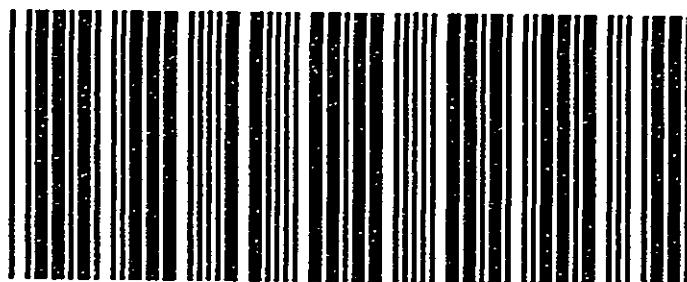

I was with Holloway when he was shot before Hill 971, Anzac on Aug. 8th 1915. The bullet went in near his shoulder and out of his back. There was a terrible wound near his backbone. Another man and I carried him in after the change to the point where the stretcher bearers were operating and left him there. He was unconscious, when we left him. I made sure of his identity and made this statement at our orderly room on the Peninsula. I do not know anything further about him.

I knew Holloway; he was a 5th. Rifle, and was in B. Co. He had a brother called Frank in the same Co. who was also a 5th. Rifle. Jim Holloway was wounded and I saw him at the 1st. Dressing Station on Sunday, 8th. Aug. at the foot of Australia Valley. He was badly wounded in the chest and bleeding heavily. This was in the Suva move. I have never heard of him again. Most of the men from this dressing station embarked from a small pier between Suva and Anzac. I am quite sure it was Jim Holloway. Frank Holloway was also wounded and I saw him at the same dressing station. There was another Holloway in the regiment but he was in the original Bn. and his number would be under 1100. H30.

Informant states that on August 8th on the left of Hill 971 Pte. J.R. Holloway was badly wounded. The bullet entered the top of left arm and passed right through the body. Informant and another man carried him into our lines. Informant saw him on the Sunday night and he was then very bad. Hill 971 was not taken by us, but the man Holloway was in a place of safety.

Dear Sir,-

We have had distressed enquiries from Australia concerning 1958 Pte. J.R. Holloway 14th Battn. 5th Rfts. A.I.F. and so far, have been able to procure only contradictory evidence.

It would be of great service to us if you would be so generous as to take the trouble to ascertain whether or not Pte. Holloway rejoined his unit in January or February of this year. He was reported wounded and missing in August 1915, and after that we can hear nothing definite of him.

We regret that it is necessary to trouble you again with this matter, but trust you will reply.
