Julian came from Ballarat as a Sgt., was raised to R.S.M. at Zeithun and received his commission shortly before the July fight.

On the 2nd. July, at Hamercourt Wood, about 8 miles from Sailly, he was out on a patrol at night and was left on the barbed wire. Her had been cut to pieces by M.G.fire. We were in the main line, exactly opposite to him and could see him on the wire the next morning.

Informant spoke in the highest terms of admiration and affection for the Lt., with whom he seems to have been intimate, speaking of him as 'Bob' and 'dear old Bob'.

"On 2nd July, 1916, at Armentieres we made a rail at night in order to divert the Germans from "the Push" in the South. Lieut. Julian was in charge of the right trench party. We got in and succeeded in what we set out to do. Lieut. Julian must have been hit coming back over the German parapet. I found him all huddled up. I took him by the belt and tried to carry him, but I had been hit myself and was too weak. Segt. Pearce (I think, but we had our faces blackened and I am not sure) tried to help me, but we saw he was finished and agreed it was hopeless. He was dead. "

Coy. tl4th Batt. tried to bring Lt.Jullian into our trenches but got him entangled in the barbed wire and could not get him in. Sergt. Pearce had told informant that Lt.Jullian was dead at the time. It was dark when this tocurred. Jullian was tall, young and clean shaven.

But. who said the actual raid was at Beis-grennier and h was also sure Lt. Jullian was dead and thought there was no possible chance of his being taken prisoner.

Wanliss saw him fall and grabbed him by the heel, but he was dead. (Initials should be H.J.) He came from Geelong, Victoria, Australia. He was a very popular man, well loved by all. The raid was successful, occurring at 1 a.m.



Dear Sir,

We have received your letter dated Sept.7th,1916, concerning your brother Lieut; R.D.Julian,14th Btn.A.I.F. We a are very sorry that we are only able to send you bad news. From several reports that we have received from men in his battalion it would seem that he was killed during a raid on the German trenches at Armentieres on July 16th.

Lieut: Wanliss, 14th Btn. admitted to 6th Auxy. Hospital (Moreton Gardens) on July 30th, says that your brother was in charge of the right trench party. He found him on the way back after the raid, which was successful, and with the help of Sergeant Peaces tried to carry him in. He was himself wounded and had to give up the attempt. He, himself, was quite sure your brother was dead.

Lieut: B. Jacka, V.C., 14th Btn., No. 3408 Corporal N. N. Lewis. 14th Etn., admitted to 3rd London General Hospital Wandsworth, No. 5477, L/Cpl. W.H. Watts, 14th Btn. A.Coy.. am others all confirm these statements.

No.3343, Pte.Heal, D. Coy, 14th Btn. - admitted to Fort Pitt Hospital, Chatham, and No

.1720 Pte.Hyatt, 14th Btn? - Ward 5, Harefield, both say that his great friend No. 3458, G.R. Pender, 14th Btn. B.Coy, went out to find him and is now posted as missing.

No. 3548, Ptc.G.M. Quigley, A.Coy.14th Btn. says that your brother was a very popular man, well loved by all, and

No.3307, Pte. H. Dredge, speaks of him in the highest terms of admiration and affection.

We are afraid that there is no possible offance of his being taken prisoner as they saw his body next morning near the German trenches.

We sympathise very deeply with you in your loss and you may be sure we will gladly send you any information thatwe . may receive later.
