He came with witness per "Medic" from Australia 18/1/16 with 7th. Reinforcements. They were both in C. Company. He was an Englishman.

During our attack at Pozieres witness was taking cover in a shell hole having come back a few yards from the German entanglements when he saw Jackson. He was satisfied he was quite dead. Shortly after this, orders came to attack. This proved unsuccedsful and they had to come right back then although the ground was eventually won on August 4th.


