He was in the 9th Bty. He died with double pneumonia at Bailleul. He was ill for several months on and off, and was recommended for a Base position by Major Morton, but no notice was taken of it. Re 326371 Dvr.H.H.Johnston, 3rd F.A.B. He was admitted 16-3-18 suffering from Pneumonia. He was very ill indeed, but at one time we hoped to be able to pull him through, as he showed slight improvement. This, however, did not continue, and he died at 4 a.m. on 27-3-18. He is buried in the British Military Cemetery, Godewaersvelde. I wrote to a brother at Darlinghurst on the 23-3-18, when the boy's condition became critical, and also on the 27-3-18.
