"I left the Battn on the 23rd of Nov. 1916 to go to the
M.G.School. Lewis was going sick when I left. When I got back to
the Battn in about 10 days I was told that Lewis had gone to Hospital
and I saw a letter which L/C Hay received from Lewis and written from
Hospital which was a stationary one, but I can't remember the name
of it. I had known Lewis for about 7 months and we were in the same
M.G.S. I am sure his number was in the four hundreds."
