

#### Major C.R. Seelenmeyer. Veterinery Corps D/W August 8/1918.

I was with Major Seelenmeyer whilst he was attending a horse at 39th Battery Horselines about 10 a.m. when he got hit with a shell. He was taken away as an Hospital badly mutilated, where he died almost immediately. L forget the locality where the casualty occurred. I do not know what hospital he was taken to; nor do I know where he is buried.

He was tall, fair, about 26 years of age. He studied at Melbourne University.

### K.I.A. 9-8-18

I did not see this casualty but was told by several men (don't remember their names) that he was going up with the ammunition waggon at the time, Aug. 8/18, when he was hit on the leg with a piece of shell. The leg was practically cut off and he died from loss of blood. This would happen in the HamelSector.

Colonel T.I.E. illiams 10th. Bde A.F.A. should be able

to tell about the casualty.
