Of A.Coy. attached to Stretcher Bearers. On 25th April during enemy's attack at Villers Bretonneux. He was stretcher bearing and coming back from R.A.P. when killed outright by shell. I was about 4 yards away at time - one piece of the shell hit him in the temple. He was buried in Military Cemetery at Aubigny. I have seen his grave - Cross erected. Knew him as "Tom". He came from N.S.W.
