

He was in D. Co., I believe IIII. Pltn. He was Acting Sorgton May the 3rd. 1917. I was alongside of him at Bullacourt on that morning, about 7a.m., daylight, when he was sniped through the stomach; he lived for about 15 minutes and was conscious. He had been hit previously in the arm about 4a.m. I spoke to him; he knew that he was finished. We did not hold the ground. He lay about 500 yards from our front line.

He was deting dergoant of D Co. 13th Fitn. I was with him on the morning of the 3rd May after we had taken the 2nd line German trench. We were advancing farther between 7 and Co.m. He was shot in the sum and had it bandaged. We were in the same shell had along with Heut. Maddrell of D Co. Acting O.C. Russell was told to go back but insisted on carrying on. We had to retire shortly after and I did not see any were of him. It is generally stated in the company that he was hilled.

Informant states that on May 3rd 1917 to the right of Bullecourt, Cpl. Russell was killed. He was in charge of the Plt. at the time. I went over with him. He was wounded by shrapnel in the erm but was killed soon afterwards with about a dozen others by a shell. I saw him killed. It was between 7 & 8 in the morning".

On May 3rd 1917 I saw No.5087 Onl Russell C.P. 23rd Battalion, lying in a shellhole badly wounded. I did not see his dead body but was afterwards told by several that he had attempted to follow up the battalion and hadbeen killed by a shell. This happened at Bullacourt.

Major of the Reinforcement. I was told by Pte-McGrath of C Co. that he had been with Russell when he was severely wounded at Bullecourt and assisted to put him into a shell hole. McGrath is servant to Capt. Hoal of C Co. McGrath is with the battalion now.

"I knew Cpl Claude L. Russell intimately. He belonged to my Coy. and Plt. He was made a Sergt just before the stunt. We were together at Bullecourt on the 3rd of May/17. We were both wounded that day. Those cases, wounded, who could not walk had all to be left behind. I however saw "Russell" in the hospital at Rouen on the 8th of May/17. He told me got badly hit in the spine; but managed to get back. I came to England on the 13th and did not see him again."

Loout 8 or 9 a.m. on May 3rd in the thick of the attack on Bullscourt I was taking a message to Lt. McSweeney. I found him wounded in a shell hole 500 yards past the German 2nd line. In the same shell hole I saw Opl. Russell. He was lying with a blanket over him. He said he had a wound in the stomech and asked me to get a stratcher bearer. It was impossible for stratcher bearers to reach him but that night volunteer stratcher bearers went for him but found him dead. The Q.K. of the Coy. - Q.H.S. Farsons - told me this. He was still there when I loft. Then I saw Russell I was pretty sure his cast was hopeless. Lt. McSweeney got back alive. Opl. Russell had been made L/Sgt. on scing in to the Bullecourt attack. He had been wounded earlier in the engagement but insisted on carrying on. A D.C.H. for him has come through orders since. His name is Claud. That is about his number. He comes from near Lebbourne, aged about 25, about 5 ft.3 and thick set, Jark. He was in the 3rd Reinforcements of the 23rd Bn. but did not come away with them, but came later. I am an original and do not know another Russell in the Battn.

Regarding 5037 Sgt. Rassell. On the Grd May the Battalion attacked the Hindenburg line near Bulleccurt. About ten minutes after Sgt. Russell reported to me that he was vounded in the arm, but would continue in the advance. A little leter he again reported a wound in the leg and still insisted on staying with his men. On the morning of May 3rd, the 23rd Btn in co-operation with other Btns attacked the Hindenburgh line near Renicourt and Handicourt. About 5 minutes after zero Sgt Russell (platoon Sgt of my platoon) was wounded in the left arm but carried on his duties. A little while and still in rear of 0.G.2 Sgt Russell was again wounded, but this time as far as I can remember he was wounded in the leg. He still a venced with the platon. On getting past 0.3.2 and near the six cross reads a German Machine Gun opened and Sgt Russell was wounded in the stomach. Afterwards we had to form a flank guard and Sgt Russell being a stretcher case had to remain in a shell hole. We afterwards had to retire to 0.G.2. it was impossible even at this stage to obtain stretchers and only those who had strength enough to oramlin could be looked after. He was reported wounded and missing. Regarding rank I am not certain, he may have been Temp. Sitod

we very much regret to isform you of an unofficial report given by a man of the same unit when in Camp in France.

Informent No 800 Fte. D. Fearce stated that your brother who was acting Sergeant of D.Coy, was with him on the morning of May 3rd, after they had taken the second line trench and during the advence between 7 and 8 s.m. He was shot in the arm. He was told to return but insisted on having it

bandaged and carrying on. Shortly afterwards they were forced to retire and he saw no more of him, but it was stated generally in the company that he was killed in Action.

We very much regret to have to send you this sed information and are making exhaustive in uiries in the hope of obtaining

definite news which we are sure you will appreciate.


