"I brought Morgan down from Factory Corner to Bazentin-le-petit. He had been killed by wounds in the chest and head by machine gun fire. He was buried at Singers Circus Cemetery, Bazentin-le-Petit."

(K. Sept. 15th 1917)

"J Morgan was one of a party of four on fatigue and about 1 a.m. was coming round a factory cover near Flers on the Somme and was killed right out by machine gun fire in the stomach. I was on fatigue at the same time near by. His body was taken away by the Co. Pioneers who should know where he was buried. I do not".
