

Creaser, of the 10th battalion; A Co.; 4th platoon; was in charge and took his disc and pay-book, and dolog they were handed in to the Battalion H.Q. I could point out the spot: there is a cross on the grave.

Captain Heming who was at the 3rd Training Battalion, Durrington, Salisbury Plain, stated that your brother was killed instantly by a pineapple bomb while digging a communication trench hehind Yarra bank at Beaulencourt on Fenruary 17th and he was buried where he fell.

No.2791 Sgt. ajor Slocombe who was in the same training battalion gave similar evidence and adding that your brother was bubied by the Pioneers at Bazentin - le Petit.

We have received the following unofficial report from 394 Pte.
V.J. Vowles, of the same Esttalion.

He states that Pte.Robinson was killed by a high explosive shell, whilst going up to the Butte le-Barre on 17-2-17. Pte. Robinson was on fatigue and was carrying duckboxeds at the time. Informant helped to bury him nearby, and a cross was erected on the grave.

We have now concluded our enquiries, and have applied for a photograph of the grave on behalf of the next of kin but should we obtain further details we shall immediately advise you.
